

Student Grant Criteria Spring 2014

The Executive Board of the Southern Nevada Chapter of the Society of Fire Protection Engineers has approved the award of \$1,000 Collegiate Student Grants for the Spring 2014 school year.

The purpose of these grants is to promote the Fire Protection Engineering industry in the Southern Nevada area. Students need not be enrolled in a fire protection engineering degree program, but must be in an accredited engineering or science program and demonstrate an interest in the Fire Protection Engineering industry in the Southern Nevada area.

These grants are open to both full and part time students that are interested in, or are currently working towards, a career in the Fire Protection Engineering industry.

A typical applicant is an undergraduate or postgraduate student in an accredited Engineering degree program and demonstrate an interest in the Fire Protection Engineering industry. Special consideration is given to applicants who have taken or are enrolled in the Fire Protection Engineering course offered at UNLV. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in classes in the field of study is required for application.

The application deadline is February 7, 2014. The Executive Board will review all Grant Applications received on or before the February 7, 2014 deadline, and select the recipients deemed most worthy in the opinion of the Board. All applicants will be notified via email with the results of the Board's decision.

The grant will be awarded at the during the Spring 2014 semester. Additionally, the recipient will be invited to attend a SFPE Chapter Meeting. The Southern Nevada Chapter of SFPE does not guarantee any/all applicants will receive a grant award, nor is the grant amount guaranteed, nor is there any obligation to make an award. The scholarship is awarded without regard to race, color, creed, ethnic background, gender, or physical capabilities.
