The Oklahoma legislature opens today and higher education will once again be a major focus as leaders consider funding for one of the state's most important economic drivers.

Bolstered by an expanding state economy, Oklahoma leaders have provided excellent support for higher education the last several years and it is important we maintain the momentum.

While affordability and access for students are two of the most pressing issues state leaders will consider, it is critical that state appropriations address the need to reward and grow faculty, expand research and technology, and fund rising health care costs.

Despite increases the last few years, tuition at OSU remains the lowest in the Big 12 Conference. OSU tuition and mandatory fees for in-state undergraduates is 81 percent of the Big 12 average. We will continue to work hard to hold down the cost of tuition.

At the federal level, many students across the nation should benefit after the Bush Administration and Congress both proposed significant increases in the Pell Grant Program. Pell Grants range from \$400 to \$4,050 a year and OSU currently has nearly 4,700 Pell recipients...
